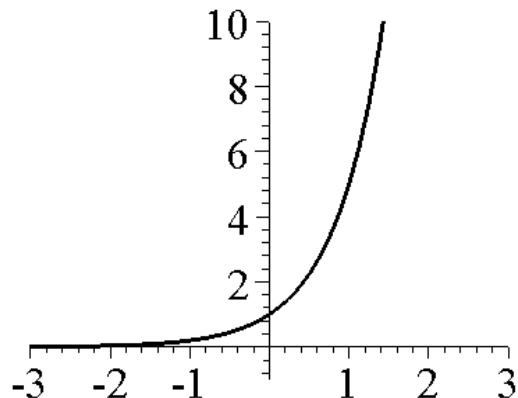


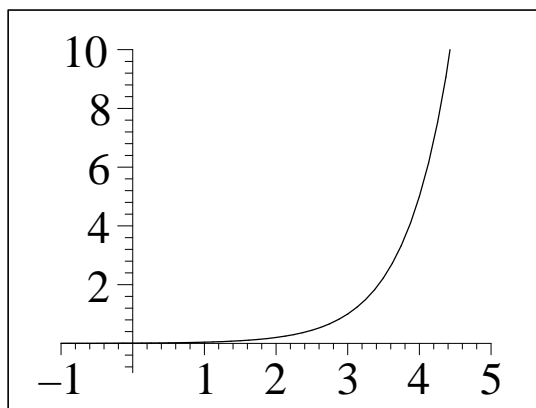
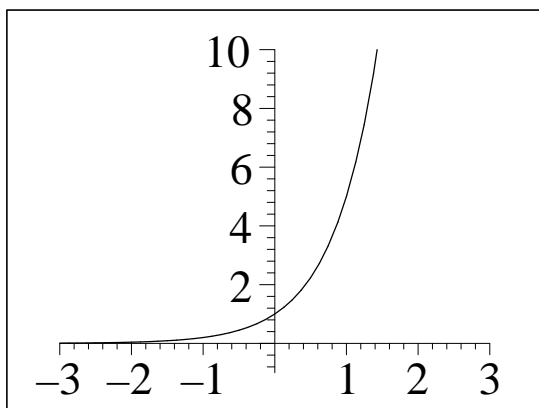
Copying Maple graphs into Word

Once you create a graph with Maple, you can copy and paste it into Word pretty easily. However, you might be unhappy with the result, if it looks like this:



This image looks pretty good in a .pdf file, but if you zoom in enough, it begins to look grainy. It is possible to get the image into Word in a better way.

Below are two Maple graphs. On a Macintosh, you can click an image in Maple, pull down Edit, Copy, then switch to Word, pull down Edit, Paste Special, and paste it as a picture. On a PC, at least on my PC, I was unable to paste in this way with Word. Maybe there are options I don't have installed. At any rate, you can use Maple to do File, Export As, LaTeX. This will produce .eps files. Then in Word, Insert, Picture, From File, and specify the .eps file.



Unfortunately, Maple appears to insist on putting the black box around the image. Still, the image quality is very good, even if you zoom in repeatedly.
